We, at Export Promotion Council for EOUs and SEZs (EPCES) are glad to address your export promotional needs in an effective and efficient manner. EPCES has always been a forerunner to support the manufacturing/services unit(s) operating under EOU Scheme as well as for SEZ units. EOU scheme is described in Chapter 6 of the Foreign Trade Policy available at https://www.dgft.gov.in/CP/?opt=ft-policy and Chapter 6 of the Handbook of Procedure available at https://www.dgft.gov.in/CP/?opt=ft-policy and Chapter 6 of the Handbook of Procedure

EPCES is conducting a survey seeking feedback from its EOU members about the working of the EOU scheme. The EOU Scheme was introduced in 1980. EOUs, unlike SEZs, provide freedom of location at a place of choice, subject to long term commitment to exports under the Customs Bond. As per information available from the Department of Commerce, there are about 1600 operational EOUs in the country contributing exports worth US\$ 17.7 Billion (Rs 1.32 lakh crore). Of late, post GST, and because of Manufacturing and Other Operations in Warehouses Regulations, 2020(MOOWR) under section Section 65/58A of the Customs Act, 1962, there have been some apprehensions about the EOU Scheme.
